







What is "Zone"?

Geographical areas that FEMA has defined according to varying levels of flood risk shown







Zones are depicted on a community's Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) or Flood Hazard Boundary Map (FHBM)

Special Flood Hazard Areas (SFHAs)

An area having special flood, mudflow, or flood-related erosion hazards, and shown on an FHBM or FIRM as Zones beginning with A or V

High Risk Areas

Zones beginning with A or V


A = Accumulation

V = Velocity

1% chance of flooding annually



SFHA Zone Designations





Did You Know?

Risks have a 26% chance of flooding during a 30 year mortgage in high risk areas versus a 10% chance of a fire





Non-Special Flood Hazard Areas (Non-SFHAs)

Areas outside SFHAs, where the flood risk is lower and where mandatory flood insurance purchase requirements and floodplain management standards do not apply

Zones B & X (Shaded)

Moderate flood hazard

Near the boundaries of SFHAs

.2% chance of flooding annually

Zones C & X (Unshaded)

Minimal flood hazard

Outside the SFHA & at higher elevations

.2% chance of flooding annually

Zone D

Possible but undetermined flood hazards

No flood hazard analysis has been conducted




Did You Know?


